The Region 9 Infant Services Committee proudly announces that the 14th Annual Early Start Symposium will take place on Friday, October 24, 2008 at the DoubleTree Hotel in Modesto. Dr. Deborah Chen will be the keynote speaker. Dr. Chen is a professor in the Special Education Department at California State University, Northridge. Her keynote presentation "Making the Most of Early Communication" will address different forms of communication that can be used by young children with special needs and their families. In addition to Dr. Chen's presentation, there will be breakout sessions presented by local experts. Session topics will include speech development, behavior, seizure disorders, visual impairment, medical advocacy, and cultural diversity.



Frank and Mark are offering a presentation covering basic topics on the evening of **May 22nd** at the Stanislaus County Office of Education building in Modesto. Topics include:

- Understanding the importance of financial planning,
- Preparing for when you're not there to help.
- Protecting government benefits through proper estate planning.
- Special Needs Trusts the basics of how they work and when they are appropriate.
- Conservatorship What is it? Situations under which it should be considered and when it should be avoided.
- Personal estate planning

Extended School Year Information from Protection and Advocacy, Inc.

Special education and related services shall be provided on an extended year basis for students with disabilities whose unique needs require services in excess of the regular academic year. The IEP team makes the determination of whether a child needs such a program and should consider as factors whether the child's disabilities are likely to continue indefinitely or for a prolonged period, or if interruption of her educational programming may cause regression and, coupled with limited recoupment capacity, render it impossible or unlikely that she will attain the level of self-sufficiency and independence that would otherwise be expected in view of her disabling condition. The lack of clear evidence of such factors may not be used to deny extended year services if the IEP team determines the need for an extended year program and includes the services in an IEP. The special education and related services offered during the extended year must be comparable in standards, scope and quality to the program offered during the regular academic year. If the IEP team recommends extended year services, the recommendation should be written into the IEP. [34 C.F. R. Sec. 300.106; C.C.R. Sec. 3043.]
