Family Resource Network (FRN) has received numerous requests for assistance with burial expenses from families following the death of their child with special needs. FRN found that few programs exist to assist families at this most difficult time. To address this need, Family Resource Network, a 501c3 nonprofit, has formed the Healing Hearts Society. Your donation to the Healing Hearts Society will provide financial assistance to families at their most difficult time. All donations are tax deductible. At this time the Society will award grants of up to \$250.

It is anticipated that requests for funds will exceed Healing Hearts Society donations. A committee will review all applications and allocate grants based on available funds. 

#### **Medication Management At School**

If your child has a chronic illness or may need to take medication during the school day for an occasional acute illness, here are four questions to help you learn about your school's medication management policies:

- 1. Is there a locked cabinet where children's medications are stored?
- 2. What staff members administer medications?
- 3. What training have these individuals received both in medication administration and in monitoring medication effects?
- 4. How are medication errors tracked? What procedures are in place for revising procedures or staff training when something seems warranted?

#### **Assistance Grants for Medical Services**

The United Healthcare Children's Foundation is offering support to meet the needs of children nationwide with assistance grants for medical services not fully covered by health insurance.

Parents and caretakers across the country will be eligible to apply for grants of up to \$5,000.00 for health-care services that will help improve their children's health and quality of life. Examples of the types of medical services covered by the foundation grants include speech therapy, physical therapy, and psychotherapy sessions, medical equipment such as wheelchair, braces hearing aids and eyeglasses, and orthodontic and dental treatments.

"The United Healthcare Children's Foundation has already helped more than 375 families and provided nearly \$1 million in financial assistance said Foundation President Matt Peterson. "We are excited about the expansion of the program and look forward to the opportunity to help many more children have access to healthcare services that will enhance their health and quality of life".

To be eligible for the grants, children must be 16 years old or younger. Families must meet economic guidelines, live in the U.S. and be covered by a commercial health insurance plan. For more information visit <a href="https://www.uhccf.org">www.uhccf.org</a>.
